**\*\*\*\*RECORD NUMBERS AT OPENING MEET:** Saturday, November 6, Old Dominion Hounds friends, family and supporters met at historic High Meadow near Flint Hill for the opening formal meet of the 2021-2022 season. The day was spectacular – from the custom-crafted, life-sized horse pinata at the entrance, to High Meadow owner Matt Neiswanger's décor from gateway to ballroom, to the string quartet and free flowing stirrup cup that met guests on the porch of the grand, stone manor house, to the lovely and meaningful blessing of the hounds (and horses, and riders, and landowners, and foxes!) by the Rev. Kate Bryant of Leeds Episcopal Church, to the 100 mounted followers (and dozens of car followers, to the superb hunting by hounds in tricky scenting conditions.

Hounds picked up a line in the rough brush on Dr. Burdick's farm by the old silo, and third field viewed a fox away to the east towards Grimsley Road from the covert. The pack worked the line carefully, but there wasn't much to go from.

They had better luck behind Fox Hill and carried a second line from there into Big Woods and nearly to the pink cottage and past to Adams processing house, but after 3 ½ hours of solid try, lifted and came in with the stalwart 15 that rode in with hounds and staff.

**\*\*\*OLD DOMINION FOOD PANTRY NEWS:** The Old Dominion Self Serve Food Pantry is located behind the post office in Orlean. The easy-access assistance system is for families who need a little help to get through the next meal.

ODFP partners with Fauquier For Immediate Sympathetic Help (FISH) to get the word out about the pantry. FISH is located in Warrenton near the Salvation Army and is a privately funded food bank. FISH arranges for needy children to take home backpacks of food every week through the elementary schools.
